

Volunteer Leadership Program



This Australian Emergency Management Institute (AEMI) course, conducted in partnership with the Australian Emergency Management Volunteers Forum (AEMVF) will provide you with the knowledge and skills to enhance the practise of leadership in your organisation.

Today's volunteer leaders must negotiate a maze of relationships, networks and expectations in order to effectively lead in the volunteer environment. Leadership demands innovation, creativity, negotiation, improvisation and strategic vision.

Content

This course runs over 4 days and will take you step by step through the facets of effective leadership.

Day 1- will explore the differences between leadership and management and discuss the usage of the appropriate leadership strategy in an organisational setting. The utilisation of personality type indicator and its relationship to effective people strategies will also be explored.

Day 2 – will explore effective self management , the setting of personal goals and decision making will be discussed and utilised in a scenario setting along with the promoting of relationships using emotional intelligence.

Day 3 – will give you the skills to communicate your message in a crisis and we will discuss leading and advocating change in the volunteer sector and contemporary issues facing the emergency management sector.

Day 4 – will discuss the utilisation of program learning in your organisational setting and the maintenance of leadership focus.

Who should participate?

Emergency service and emergency sector volunteer personnel from the affiliated agencies of the AEMVF that are in, or aspire to, a leadership role.
